Colonel Andrus first flew in 1921, in an aircraft piloted by then Captain H. "Hap" Arnold. Andrus then attended the Air Corps Tactical School, graduating in 1928, when he was awarded observer wings. Subsequently he taught air-ground coordination at the Cavalry School, Ft. Riley, Kansas. He survived two major crashes as an observer. After WWII, he served as Commandant of the Nuremburg Prison during the war crimes trials.
