BRUCE KEENER HOLLOWAY

1912 - 1999

Bruce Holloway, a native of Knoxville, Tennessee, graduated from West Point in 1937 and entered the Army Air Corps. He served in fighter units in Hawaii and China. In 1943 he commanded the 23d Fighter Group under General Chennault and shot down 13 Japanese aircraft. After the war Holloway commanded fighter groups, was promoted to brigadier general in 1953, commanded U. S. Air Forces Europe and was Vice Chief of Air Staff in 1966. Holloway's last assignment was Commander-in-Chief of the Strategic Air Command and he retired in 1972. For his long and distinguished service, he was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, Silver Star, Legion of Merit, and the Distinguished Flying Cross. Bruce Holloway and his wife, Frances, raised three daughters.
