Angelo John Scalia was born in Bastrop, Louisiana and attended school there through junior college. He entered the Army Air Corps in 1941 and was sent to Italy in 1943 as a P-38 pilot. He was a decorated combat pilot by 1945 and was one of the pilots selected to provide the top cover for the American attendees to the Yalta Conference. After the war he remained active in the Reserves until his retirement in 1976. He had a successful career in the paper industry until his retirement as vice president of Southern Paper and Supply in West Monroe, Louisiana where he was also active in the community. He was preceded in death by his wife, Chloe. They raised a daughter and two sons.
